

The format of the July 2025 exam was a 2-paper exam of 100 questions each.


1786 candidates sat an online exam: 983 sat a proctored exam in the UK, 1 sat an online exam in international centre and 802 sat a proctored exam outside the UK; there were more male than female candidates and more BAME than White candidates. 31.2% of the total 1786 candidates have self-declared as UK resident doctors.




Candidate performance

The pass rate for White candidates is the highest. Candidates sitting a proctored exam in the UK and internationally had a pass rate of 60.9% (1088/1786).


Female candidates are passing in a higher proportion than male candidates, a higher proportion of White candidates is passing than BAME candidates and non-UK resident doctors have a lower pass rate than those training in the UK (*Note: training data is self-declared*).



The mean of equated scores is highest for White candidates and lowest for BAME candidates.




Candidate scores distribution shows many candidates scoring between 400 and 525 (mean=491.5, stdev=125.9, median=481, mode=523). The pass mark is established at **454**. In this examination the number of correct answers for a pass is **124** out of 199 scored questions.




Topic performance

Candidates overall, including those who passed, have the highest mean percent correct in Psychiatry and the lowest in Neurology. The same trend is observed in UK resident doctors' performance.
